There are very few, if any, instructors in construction programs at South African universities who have the knowledge and/or experience of 'teaching' using a constructivist student-centered and student-driven pedagogy because they are typically schooled in and familiar with the

positivist 'sage on the stage' lecturercentered and driven approaches

There are consequently also very few, if any, students in these programs who have experienced being taught using this approach where the emphasis is on 'learning by doing'.

THE FACILITATORS OF LEARNING BOOTCAMP 25

This bootcamp seeks to build capacity by providing you by with the skills needed to navigate this alternative approach to current instructional practices.

A few aspects that will be covered and their approaches formulated:

- The relationships between the profiles of both students and instructors and the paradigm shift to the IBL/SBL/PBL pedagogy,
- Effectiveness and impact of the use of learning by doing
- Development of metrics to measure effective learning as opposed to teaching
- Impact of the paradigm shift on levelling the playing fields in terms of academic performance and success of students
- Impacts of the iterative 'propose, critique, reflect, propose' cycle,
- Measuring the outcomes in terms of problem solving, communication, collaboration and related skills,

OUTCOMES AND EXPECTATIONS

The bootcamp will again be run by experienced facilitators to train you to become facilitators of learning equipped to use constructivist and active learning techniques in your classrooms including developing appropriate student learning outcomes (SLOs).
